History 306: U.S. History Through Film. (3) This course will analyze significant events and individuals in U.S. history as interpreted through the movie lens. Events to be examined will include, for example, the Civil War, the Great Depression, and Civil Rights. Students will learn to view films critically while also exploring the use of film to teach and learn history. Prerequisites, one of the following: History 201, History 202, Art History, or permission of instructor.

Social Work 320. Professional Practice with Immigrants, Refugees, and the Deaf and Hard of Hearing Populations.
