

**MacMurray College's  
Transfer Guide  
For Richland Community College Students**

Richland credits are fully transferable to MacMurray College, except for certain vocational-technical courses. Students will receive transfer credit, up to 60 hours, for courses successfully taken with grades of C– or better.

MacMurray participates in the Illinois Articulation Initiative (IAI). Therefore:

**Students who have completed the Illinois General Education Core Curriculum:**

❖ **will have satisfied MacMurray's lower division requirements (listed below).**

**In addition, students who earn an *Associate in Arts* or *Associate in Science* degree:**

❖ **will be granted 60 transfer credits (junior standing) at MacMurray.**

If students have not completed the entire General Education Core Curriculum, the following courses will satisfy the individual general education requirements at MacMurray.

**MacMurray Requirement**

**What to do at Richland**

Mac 101 (Orientation to college).....Two full-time semesters or equivalent at Richland.

Rhetoric sequence (3 courses) .....ENGL 101 and 102 and SPCH 101.

Math 121 (1 course)

(Mathematics for Liberal Arts) ....Either MATH 104, 110, or 116, or a calculus course, or ACT math subscore 27 or higher.

*Breadth courses:*

Natural Sciences (with lab, 1 course) Introductory lab course in biology, chemistry, earth science, or physics: BIOL 101, 201, 210; CHEM 100, 131; EASCI 210, 220, 230; PHYSC 105; PHYS 101, 151

Social Sciences (1 course) .....Introductory course in anthropology, economics, history, political science, psychology, or sociology: ANTHRO 110, 120, 130; ECON 231, 232; HIST 101, 102, 105, 111, 112, 201, 270; POLS 100, 110, 120; PSYCH 110; SOCIO 110.

Humanities (1 course).....Introductory course in literature, philosophy, religion, or language: AFAM 104; ENGL 115, 124, 126, 128, 160, 201, 202, 231, 232, 240, 251, 252; PHIL100, 110, 120, 210, 215, 220, 230; or one semester of a foreign language.

Fine Arts (1 course) .....Introductory course in art, creative writing, music, oral interpretation, or theatre: AFAM 103, 105; ART 100, 101, 111, 115, 121, 123, 125, 127, 210, 220, 230; DRAMA 150, 170; ENGL 140, 220; HUMAN 100; MUSIC 100, 180, 190; SPCH 210

*Upper division general education requirements, not available at Richland:*

sequence (3 courses) .....Three MacMurray IOCC courses required; two if the student brings 60 credit hours.

Cultural Studies 300 (1 course).....Diversity and the American Experience

Junior-level writing exam .....Essay exam to be taken at MacMurray after junior standing is reached.

*MacMurray will send an official evaluation of transfer credit after a MacMurray application has been accepted, and after the official Richland transcript has been received.*
