Professional dress is typically **NOT**:

- blue jeans
- sweatshirts (hooded also)
- flip-flops
- hoods
- bandanas
- leggings
- stirrup pants
- spaghetti straps
- halter-tops
- clothes with holes
- exposed tattoos
- any clothes extreme in style
- clothing that depicts images or texts
- clothing that reveals one's stomach, private areas, or underwear when standing or kneeling/bending over or stretching
- t-shirts
- sneakers
- hats
- headbands
- sunglasses
- stretch pants (spandex)
- shorts
- tank tops
- short skirts (above the knees)
- see-through shirts or skirts
- excessive body piercing

Professional dress typically **IS**:

For Women

- blouse
- skirt (knee length)
- jumper
- dress slacks/khakis
- dress
- sweater
- dress jacket
- pant suit
- low-heeled (comfortable) or flats
- dress sandals

For Men

- collared shirt
- slacks/dress khakis
- tie (your choice)
- polo shirt
- sweater
- leather shoes
