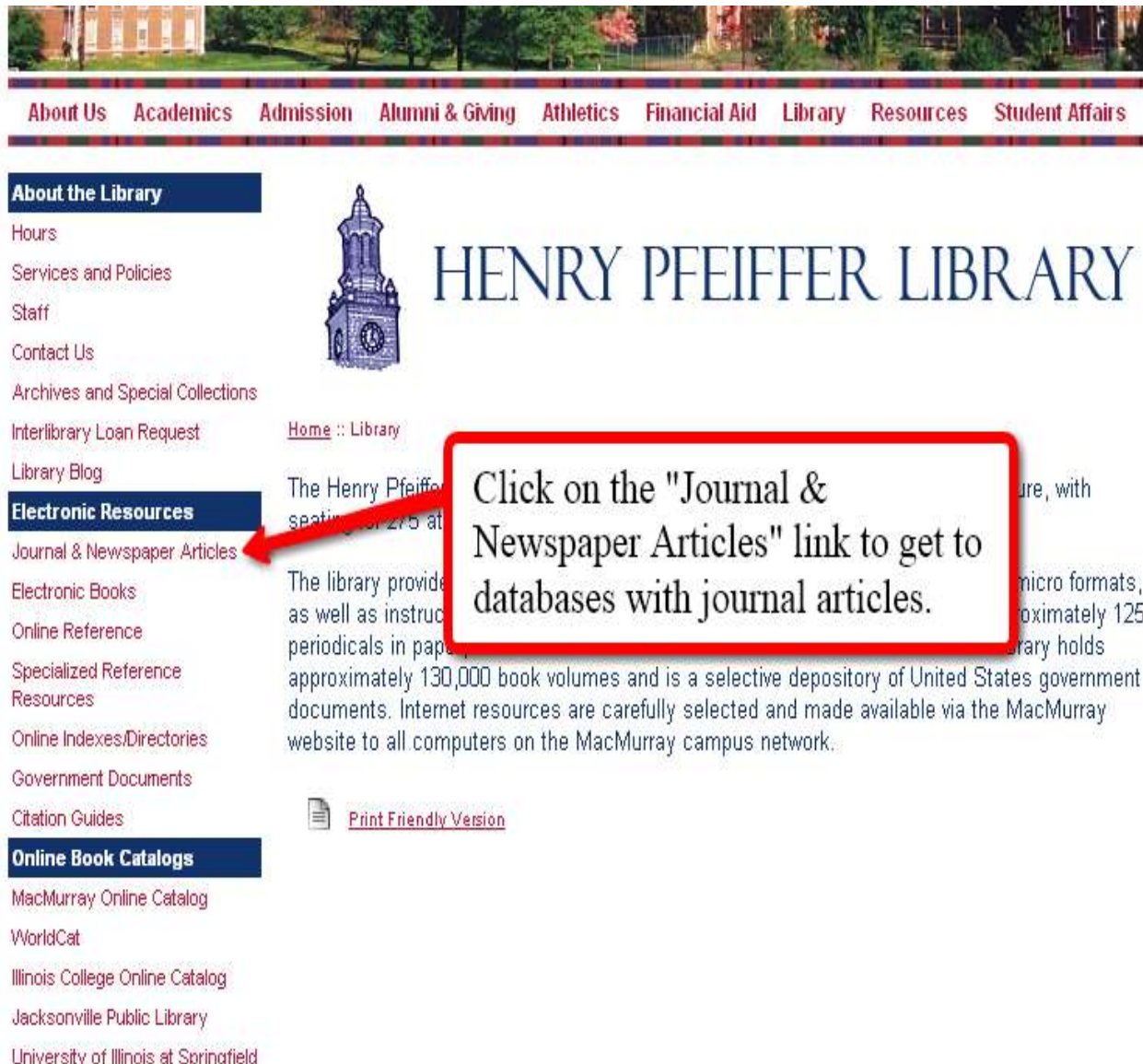

- Academic Search Premier is a general database for journal articles on a variety of subjects. It offers full-text of more than 4,500 journals. In addition, the database provides abstracts for more than 8,000 additional journals.
- Since not all of these articles are available immediately in full-text, be aware that you might need to request them via interlibrary loan.
- Interlibrary loan is a service we provide where we borrow a book or journal article that we don't own from another library that does own it. Books will usually take about a week to get, depending on how many libraries own them and where the libraries are located. Articles are usually e-mailed or faxed within a couple of days.

This database uses keyword searching. The words "global" and "warming" appear somewhere in the record, not necessarily together.

Academic Search Premier

When we perform this search, we come back with over 22,000 results. Obviously, this is way too many. However, it is a good idea to start out broad and narrow your way down to relevant results. By doing this, you have a better chance of getting all the articles on your topic.

Academic Search Premier

Another idea that is important to understand when using databases is that each one uses something called a controlled vocabulary. This means that the creators of the database use certain subject terms, or thesaurus terms, to index the entries in the database. It is always a good idea to try and use these terms whenever possible.

After opening the pull down menu, adding a check mark next to the “GLOBAL warming” subject term, and clicking “Update,” notice that the number of results has been reduced by about half. These represent the articles that are actually about global warming and don’t just happen to have the words “global” and “warming” somewhere in the entry.

Whenever possible, use subject terms.

Academic Search Premier

If you are presented with a choice between PDF Full Text and HTML Full Text, it is usually a good idea to opt for PDF. PDF is a scan of the article the way it appears in the journal. They contain page numbers, making them easier to cite, and whatever images, graphs, or tables they contain are in the article where they appear in print. HTML is a scrolling web page without breaks for pages. Images are tacked on at the end, if they are included at all.
